Psalms 53:1-3 (ESV) The fool says in his heart, "There is no God."

They are corrupt, doing abominable (worthy of causing disgust) iniquity;

There is none who does good.

<sup>2</sup> God looks down from Heaven on the children of man

To see if there are any who understand, who seek after God.

<sup>3</sup> They have all fallen away; together they have become corrupt;

There is none who does good, not even one.

James 2:14-26 (ESV) What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith

But does not have works? Can that faith save him?

<sup>15</sup> If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food,

And one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled,"

Without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that?

<sup>17</sup> So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

<sup>5</sup> A **false** witness will **not** go unpunished, and he who **breathes** out **lies** will **not** escape.

<sup>6</sup> Many **seek** the favor **of** a generous man,

And everyone is a friend to a man who gives gifts.

<sup>7</sup> All a poor man's brothers <u>hate</u> him; how much more do his friends go <u>far</u> from him! He pursues them with words, but does not have them.

And a wife's quarreling is a continual dripping of rain.

Proverbs 26:10-11 (NLT) An employer who hires a fool or a bystander

Is **like** an archer who shoots **recklessly**.

[11] As a dog returns to its vomit, so a fool repeats his folly.

Proverbs 30:31-32 (ESV) If you have been foolish, exalting yourself,

Or **if** you have been **devising** evil, **put** your hand **on** your mouth.

For **pressing** milk **produces** curds, **pressing** the nose **produces blood**,

And **pressing anger** produces **strife**.

Who <u>opposes</u> and <u>exalts</u> himself <u>against</u> every so-called god or object of worship, So that he **takes** his seat in the temple of <u>God</u>,

Proclaiming himself to be God.

<sup>6</sup> And you **know** what is **restraining** him **now** 

So that he may be revealed in his time.

Only He who now restrains it will do so until he is out of the way.
